WELCOME GUEST MUSICIAN ERIC MILLARD, who has been serving as Visiting Professor of Trumpet, and will permanently join the faculty as Assistant Professor of Trumpet at the University of North Carolina at Charlotte. Millard was formerly the Third/Associate Principal trumpet with the Tallahassee Symphony, and has also performed with the Boise Philharmonic, Ballet Idaho, Pensacola Symphony, Sinfonia Gulf Coast, Northwest Florida Symphony, and Albany Symphony. Millard's fond interest in chamber music has led him to cofound both the Bluegrass Brass and Garnet and Brass quintets. He was a member of the Florida State University Faculty Brass Quintet. In addition to brass quintets, Millard has won prizes at the National Trumpet Competition (NTC) with multiple trumpet ensembles.
